Blythe Koyiyumtewa is Hopi from the village of Hotevilla located on Third Mesa in northern Arizona.

Blythe is an Agricultural Engineer with the NRCS Area Office in Flagstaff, Arizona. She attended the University of Arizona in Tucson, where she earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Agricultural & Biosystems Engineering. While in college, she began her career with NRCS as a student intern through the Student Career Experience Program. After graduation, she continued work with the NRCS Flagstaff Resource Support Team, now Flagstaff Area Office, as one of the Area Engineers. As part of the Area Office engineering team, Blythe works with a fellow AIANEA member and Engineer to provide assistance to northern Arizona NRCS field office's with survey, design and construction, training to staff, while building and maintaining the program administratively. Blythe has also served as the American Indian/Alaska Native Special Emphasis Program Manager (AI/AN SEPM) for Arizona NRCS.

Blythe is a Lifetime member of the AIANEA. She has participated on AIANEA committees and currently serves as the Vice Chair for the Elder's committee. She feels that the Elders and the members of AIANEA are a very special part of the unique work that NRCS is involved with on tribal lands, working with tribal people. Blythe's connection as a Hopi person working with NRCS and being active with the AIANEA has been invaluable to her career and as an individual.

Hopi culture and family keeps Blythe busy during all other times. Blythe and her husband, also from Hotevilla, have a daughter and a son who help maintain the family's simple perspective on life. For them, being active in Hopi culture is at the forefront in maintaining balance and focus on family, work and school. These key roles have carried Blythe through over a decade of service with NRCS.
